




# Maths Challenges

2. Make each line add up to 20.




3. Make up your own puzzle like this.

There are nine different ways to pay 45p exactly using only silver coins.



## How to weave paper



1. Cut a rectangle from thick paper. Lay a ruler along one end and draw a line across it. Then, cut straight slits into the paper as far as the pencil line.




2. Cut lots of strips for weaving, from different papers. They need to be longer than the width of the paper rectangle, but they don't need to be exactly the same width.




Woven shapes


Cut different shapes from woven paper. Tape all over the back before cutting out a shape.



3. Weave one of the paper strips over, then under the strips in the rectangle, like this. Then, push the strip up to the top so that it touches the pencil line.




4. Weave a second strip, but this time start with the strip going under, then over the strips in the rectangle. Push it up to touch the first strip.

5. Weave more strips following steps 3 and 4. Then, turn the weaving over and tape along the edges. Cut the ends off the strips and trim off the top edge.




Instead of cutting straight slits into the rectangle, draw wavy lines from the pencil line to the bottom of the paper. Cut along them, then weave straight strips across.

# Try out this idea for a handprint project.

### **INGREDIENTS**

500g of plain flour 250g salt 250mls of water (add slightly more water if necessary)

Bake in oven on lowest heat for 3 hours or until rock hard (took about 4 hours for ours)

#### **INSTRUCTIONS**

Mix the flour and salt then add the water. Mix into a dough. Roll out onto flat surface into desired shape about 1-1.5cm thick (remember to sprinkle some flour down to prevent sticking). Place on a baking tray. Make hand imprints (as deep/clear as possible). Place in the oven on the -lowest heat possible- and leave for 3-4 hours or until completely solid top and bottom. (Check the bottom is rock solid before you take it out and make sure you have it on the oven's lowest heat or it will burn instead. Alternatively you can leave to air dry for a couple of days in a cool dry place).

Paint with your choice of paints/colours. Seal with any kind of varnish or sealer to preserve it for example, varnish, or a PVA and water mix. If you don't have paints then make it and paint it at a later date!
