What I should already know:

History skills:

What I will know by the end of the topic:

- Yate is a town in South Gloucestershire, surrounded by countryside. Yate is 1000 years old, in the past, it had 40 farms used to make dairy, corn and meat produce. Yate has developed into an industrial area. Will be able to look at maps of Yate at different ages and identify what has changed and stayed the same.
- Look at photographs of Yate railway and explore how it has developed. It used to transport people, coal, lime, building stone and livestock, but now it transports people along the mainline to Birmingham and beyond. Will explore the impact this had on the growth of Yate, and how cars impacted the railway.
- Explore photographs of Yate's Parnell factory and
