Industrial revolution	A period of change where lots of things were invented in factories.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> That 'The Victorians' are people who lived during the reign of Queen Victoria. That Queen Victoria became queen in 1837 until 1901. She became queen aged 18 and was queen for 64 years. She married Prince Albert in 1840 and they had 9 children. That during this time, Britain had an industrial revolution. Cities got much bigger, lots of people worked in factories and lots of things were invented like the stamp, bicycles, lightbulbs and Christmas cards! That steam trains were invented and Brunel designed the Great Western Railway and Box tunnel so people could travel between London and Bristol. That North Road Primary School was built during the Victorian era. The similarities and differences between schools, homes, holidays and toys and games from the Victorian era and now.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> 1837 – Queen Victoria became Queen at 18 years of age. The Houses of Parliament were built. 1840 – Queen Victoria married Prince Albert. 1841 – The Great Western Railway was completed. 1842 – Children were stopped from working in mines. 1844 – The Factory Act stopped children aged between 8 and 13 working more than 6.5 hours a day. 1864 – A new law meant boys under 10 could no longer work as chimney sweeps. 1870 – Schools were provided for children aged 5 – 10 years old. 1880 – All children had to go to school. 1887- Queen Victoria's Diamond Jubilee. 1891- All children aged 5-13 had access to free education. 1901- Queen Victoria died and Edward VII became King. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> We are learning about the life of Queen Victoria We will be asking and answering questions to learn about typical Victorian childhoods We will know significant events in the timeline of our Victorian school and the children that attended it.
