

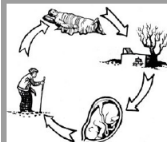

General		Key Figures or Gods	Key Beliefs
Afterlife	Life after death – the belief of this is different in different religions.	Prophet Muhammad – In the Islamic religion, he is recognised as the last prophet or messenger of Allah. Jesus Christ - Christians see God as Father and Creator and Jesus as the Son of God and an inspiration to Christian people. They believe that Jesus died on the Cross to give us salvation / forgive us from our sins.	A ritual is a ceremony or series of acts that is always performed the same way. The soul is the spiritual part of a person believed to give life to the body. Hanukkah is a Jewish festival with 8 days of celebrations. Diwali is a Hindu festival of lights. The Five Pillars of Islam are an expression of Ibadah (worship and belief in action). Muslims put the teachings of the Qur'an and the words and actions of Prophet Muhammad into practice to make a difference to the lives of Muslims. For example the giving of Sadaqah (voluntary charity) and the importance of the Ummah.
Bereavement	Grieving over the death of a loved one.		
Death	The end or ending of life.		
Eulogy	A speech that praises someone who has died.		
Forgiveness	A decision to free yourself from holding on to resentment and feelings of revenge towards someone who hurt you.		
Heaven	The place where God or the gods live, in some religions.		
Scriptures	Sacred writings for different religions found in holy books – e.g. the Bible and the Torah.		
Sin	An action that breaks a religious law.	What will we know at the end of this term?

Resurrection	Coming back to life after death.	• Christians believe in God and the implications of this, including belief in sin, forgiveness and heaven.	
Salvation	The saving of a person from sin or evil.	• The significance of the Bible and biblical stories as a source of authority and wisdom, including salvation, and Jesus' death and resurrection.	
Islam		• The meaning and significance of rituals which mark death.	
Judgement	When Allah decides how people will spend their afterlife.	• What it means to be part of the Christian community when dealing with hardship.	
Junnah	Muslim concept of heaven (paradise) in the afterlife.	Islam	
Recording Angels	Two angels called Raqib and Atid, believed by Muslims to record a person's actions.	• The meaning and significance of rituals in Islam, which mark important points in life e.g., death.	
Hinduism		Hinduism	
Karma	In Hinduism and Buddhism – good or bad karma is earned through good or bad actions. This can lead to different forms of reincarnation.	• Beliefs about the cycle of birth, life, death and reincarnation.	
Reincarnation	A person or animal who dies, then their soul is born again inside another person or animal.	Religions believe different things about what happens to us after death. Each religion guides its followers in how to live their lives depending on what they believe about the afterlife.
